

## CAW Studio Features

The CAW studio is heated and air conditioned. It has a restroom, a coffee machine and a chilled water dispenser.

### Hours

Normal hours are from 8:30 to 2:30 during Skill Enhancement Workshops (SEW) and Visiting Artist Workshops.

Lunches are available from a variety of local establishments (we order-bring cash), or members may bring their own lunches. A lunch break is normally taken from 12:00-12:30.

### Supervision/ Instruction

Workshops are manned by multiple experienced turners who can explain and demonstrate the use of tools and equipment.

### Cleanup

All participants are expected to fully clean their work areas. Clean up includes; cleaning and vacuuming lathes and adjacent areas, putting away all tools and equipment used, throwing away all trash, ensuring restroom and common areas have been left in an orderly condition. Wood pieces chain sawed or cut on the bandsaw should also be taken away.

### Materials

Participants are expected to bring their own materials. In certain instances, arrangements can be made with shop organizer to chainsaw some pieces however, this must be pre-arranged. Before using a band saw, check with workshop supervisors. Occasionally, wood is available for purchase. Contact us for availability.

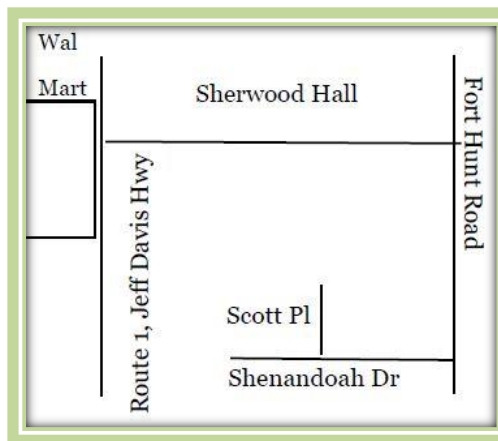

Stubby	1	24 in
Jet	1	146in
Jet midi	2	12 in

Each lathe has electronic speed controls. Woodworking wonders task lights are on all lathes except the Stubby.

Both Oneway 1640s and one Oneway 1224 have vacuum chucks
